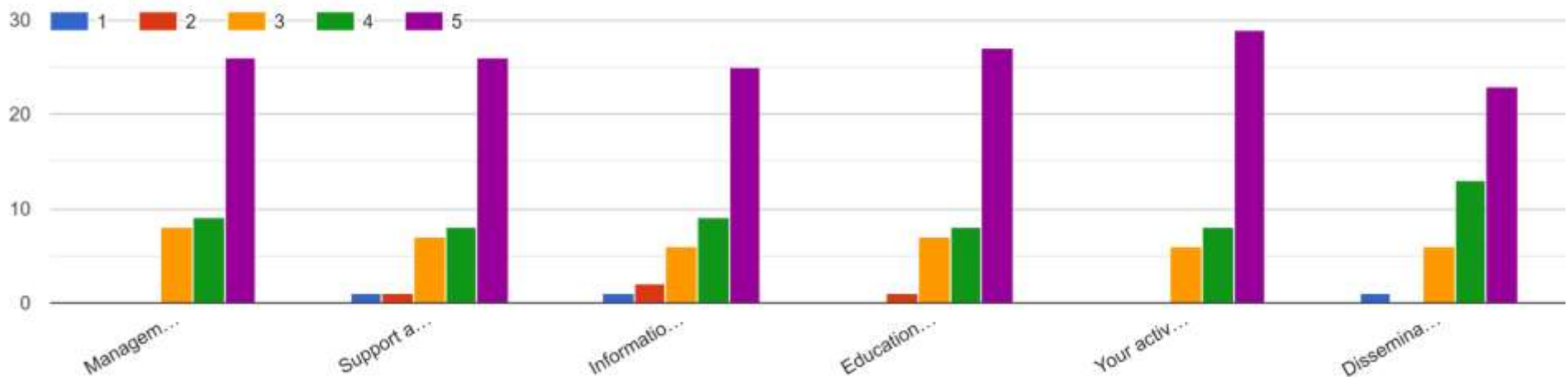
On the last day of the YE of CACAT-NFE-FORI (on 1ST OF AUGUST 2025) of our activities participants of the project answered online the following questionnaire.

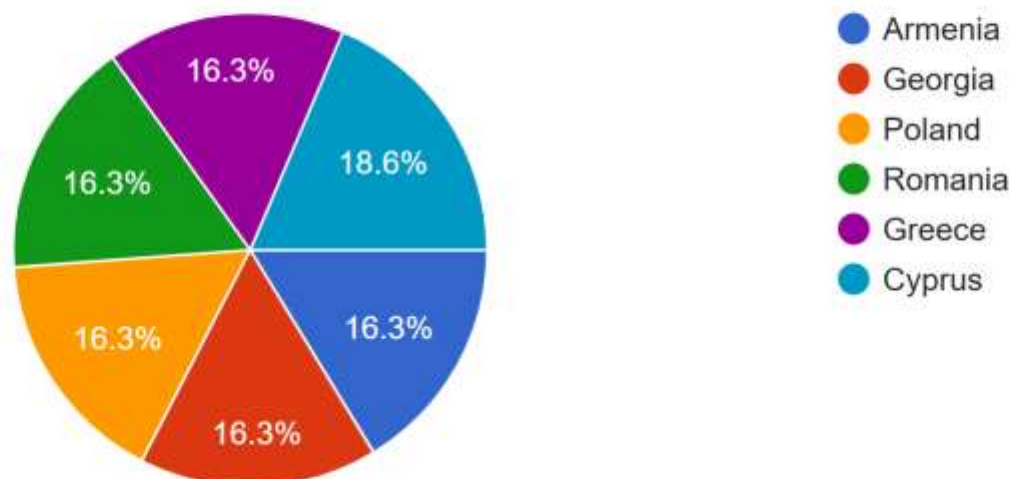
Management and Organisation Questions

Another serious concern was the lack of adequate support for healthcare issues. In a setting where participants are away from home, this should be a priority — especially when some people were visibly unwell and didn't receive proper attention or help.

Finally, there seemed to be a disconnect between the project's values and the behavior of some participants. When a program is centered on human rights — including topics like gender equality and LGBTQ+ rights — it's essential that both participants and organizers actively uphold and reflect those values.

The management and organization of the project were lacking.

Important information was not communicated clearly, and the leaders didn't show much care for participants' needs. For example, when someone needed medicine and couldn't find it in the town, there was no support or help from the organizers. Bobby mentioned that it's unethical for the organization to ask for a participation fee. Every Armenian paid. And not cheap. Nuh the management was very organised as much as the informations we earned from them Everything was alright

It was very entertaining

While I deeply appreciated the opportunity to participate in this Erasmus+ project, I believe that the management and organizational aspects could have been significantly improved. One major issue was the lack of cohesion among participants — people remained in isolated subgroups, and no one from the organizing team actively stepped in to encourage meaningful integration or bonding. This had a negative impact on the overall group dynamic and project spirit.

Unfortunately, some instances of disrespect and inconsistency went unchecked, which undermined the core purpose of the exchange.

 Also, the infopack needs to be edited a bit because it was confusing for us. One slide said that we must bring our own bed sheets and towels but then turns out we are provided one.

 We realized here that the sending organisation took money from us that they weren't supposed to take (they took 75€ as a participation fee and 75€ for visa support, turns out, according to other participants, that we were the only team that paid those fees).
 Also, it seems that a lot of people will be reimbursed acropolis and subway tickets too, however, we won't or we weren't told that we could do that (we were told that all the expenses outside the project must be covered by us).

Additionally, there were clear cases of favoritism or privilege, with certain participants receiving noticeably more attention, comfort, or responsibilities than others. Such imbalances should have been addressed and prevented by the management team to ensure a fair and inclusive environment for all.

That said, I genuinely enjoyed participating in the activities as they were — they created a lively atmosphere and helped build rapport among participants, even if they didn't dive as deeply into the topic as I would have hoped.

Any additional comments?

The project itself was well organised but the participant evaluation process was messy. The project was postponed from April to July and none of the applicants received any notice up until late May.

I would love to participate in more of erasmus+ projects to get the experience of different cultures and lives.

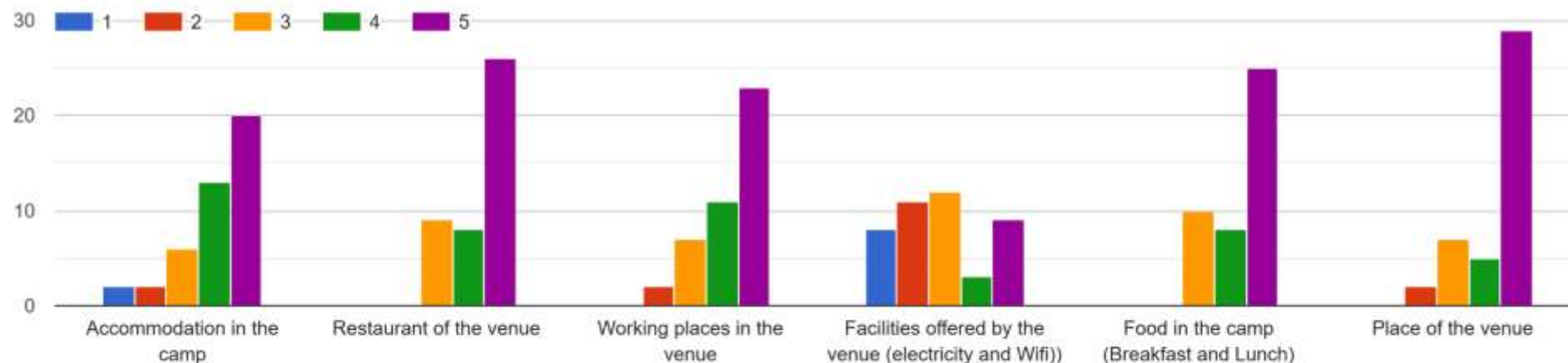
The camp was not ideal – it lacked comfort, practicality, and a professional atmosphere.

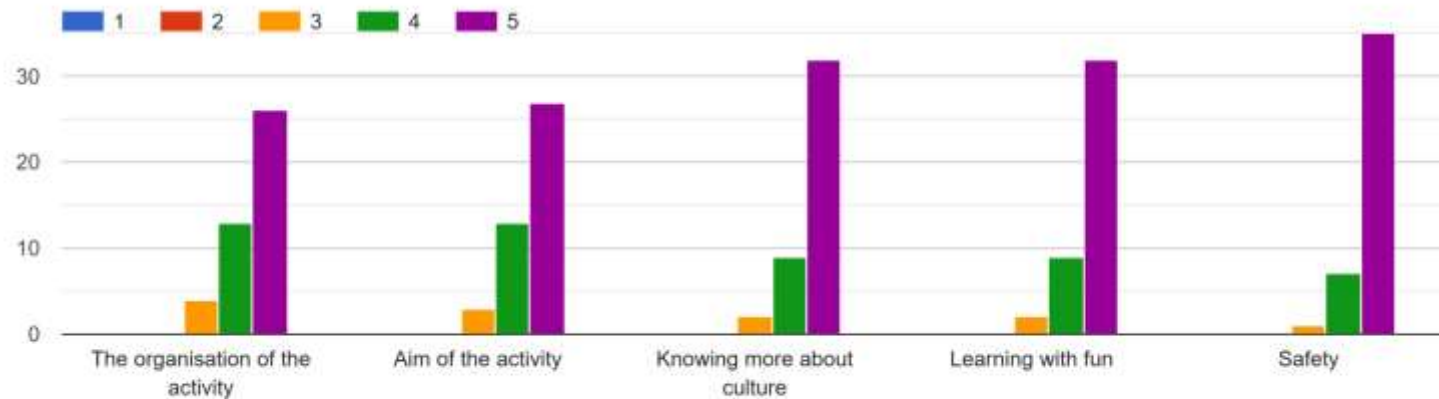
I dont have any complain, i enjoyed so much that i didnt see something that i dont like.

Unfortunately, I was very dissatisfied with the accommodation. The camping area was extremely uncomfortable and unhygienic. For a short stay of 1–2 days it might have been tolerable, but staying there for over a week was a real challenge. The tents were overcrowded (five people per tent), it was very hot, there was no proper place to store clothes, and the bathroom conditions were terrible — dirty, not functioning properly, and full of insects and animals. I counted over 20 different types of bugs and creatures, and at times there were more lizards in the bathroom than participants in the project. The Wi-Fi also didn't work at all, which made it difficult to stay in touch or access important information.

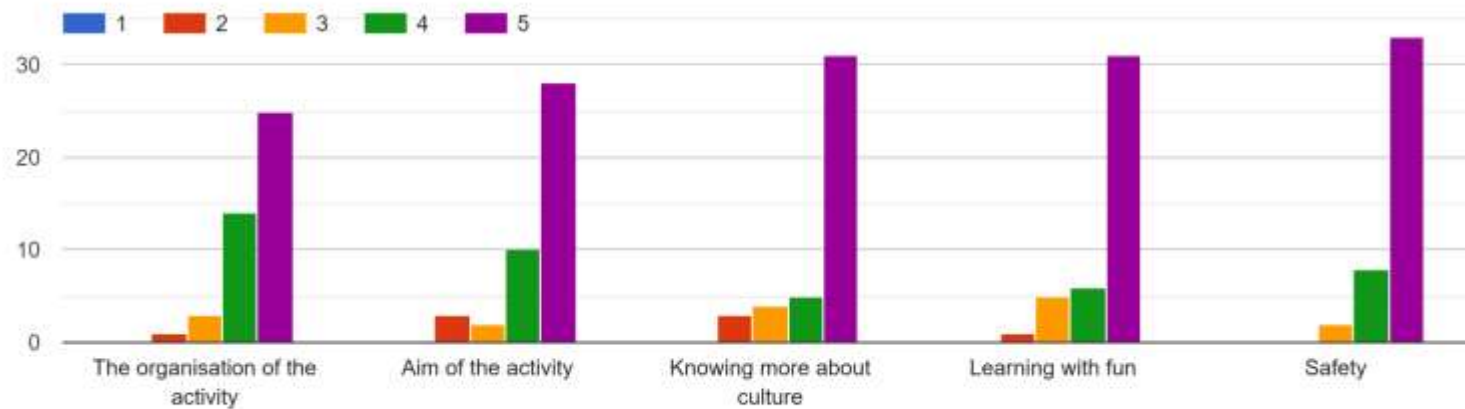
Everything was so good except the wifi, therefore I recommend check the wifi access before chosing the place 🙄🙄
