The project employed both non-formal and informal educational methodologies, allowing participants to be involved and heard through various interactive activities that included group work, practical tasks, digital tools, and self-reflection. Participants developed the competencies that will help them improve their intercultural competencies. Enhancing resilience against discrimination and intolerance among youth.
